Homemade Patch Activity


Supplies:

- Markers/Crayons
- Super Glue
- Optional: Laminator/ Laminator sheets

How-To:

- 1. Have students color patch.
- 2. Place a small line of glue and attach the pin back.







184th Fact Sheet

- The 184th Attack Squadron is a Unit of the Arkansas Air National Guard 188th Wing.
- The Squadron fly A-10Cs until 2014 when they switched to MQ-9 Reapers
 - A-10C
 - A-10s nose art was painted to look like razorbacks.
 - The A-10 is also nicknamed the Tank Killer
 - Can shoot up to 3900 RPM.
 - Flies at the speed of 439 MPH
 - MQ-9
 - 2 ground station operators
 - Top speed is 194 MPH
- The 184th was activated in 1953 and is still active today.
- They are based at Ebbing Air National Guard, Fort Smith, Arkansas
- They were originally named Ricks' Rippers in honor of Major General Earl T.
 Ricks, but now they are known as the Flying Razorbacks
- In coming years Ebbing Air National Guard Base will become the home of the Republic of Singapore Air Force and train the F-16s and F-35s.
 - Ebbing is named after Henry F. Ebbing died in a training accident in November of 1970 in South Carolina, but was buried in the Holy Cross Cemetery in Fort Smith, AR.
 - He was the first member of the 188th to die in active duty.
